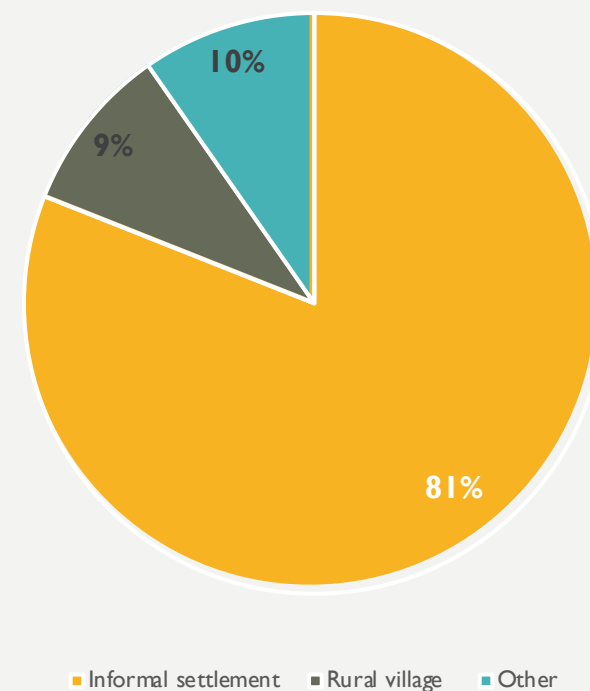

METRO

TUESDAY 30 JUNE 2020: Women are scared to use shared taps and toilets at night. Two thirds of Asivikelane participants are women and most of them say that there is not enough public lighting in their informal settlements. On the bright side, most metros now have green traffic lights for water however sanitation is still at critical levels. We hope that metros will use their share of the R11 billion of additional equitable share funding announced by Minister Mboweni, as well as reprioritised conditional grant funding, to address this problem.

HOTSPOTS

- Residents in all metros, except in parts of Buffalo City, reported inadequate public lighting. The problem is worst in Johannesburg and Ekurhuleni with 90% of residents saying that public lighting is inadequate.
- Sanitation continues to be a serious problem:
 - Some residents in Johannesburg, eThekweni and Cape Town still report that they do not have access to sanitation.
 - In eThekweni and to a lesser extent in Johannesburg and Cape Town, dirty toilets remain a problem.
 - In Cape Town and eThekweni residents continue to report that broken and blocked toilets are not being fixed.

GOOD NEWS!

- The Minister of Finance announced an increase of R11 billion in equitable share funding for local governments to provide basic services.
- Toilet cleaning improved significantly in Cape Town and Johannesburg. Both metros are getting closer to green.
- Most metros are continuing to provide some soap and hand sanitiser, with Buffalo City and eThekweni leading the way.
- Ekurhuleni is the only metro where refuse removal has improved, and their traffic light is very close to green.

HOTSPOTS

- Many Port St. Johns, Emfuleni, Emalahleni and Msunduzi residents do not have access to municipal sanitation and have had to construct their own pit toilets.
- Many residents from Port St. Johns, Emalahleni and Emfuleni also do not have regular access to water.
- Apart from Mossel Bay, non-metro municipalities did not provide residents with soap or hand sanitizer.



GOOD NEWS!

- Mossel Bay and Msunduzi did better than most metros in the provision of public lighting in informal settlements.
- Knysna's toilet traffic light has turned green because all residents reported that their toilets have been cleaned.
- Although still at crisis levels, Msunduzi and Emfuleni have made a start on toilet cleaning.
- Emalahleni has improved significantly with water provision, refuse removal and the provision of hand sanitiser, although at this point, not enough for their traffic lights to change from red.

Fig 2. - Number of service delivery upgrades

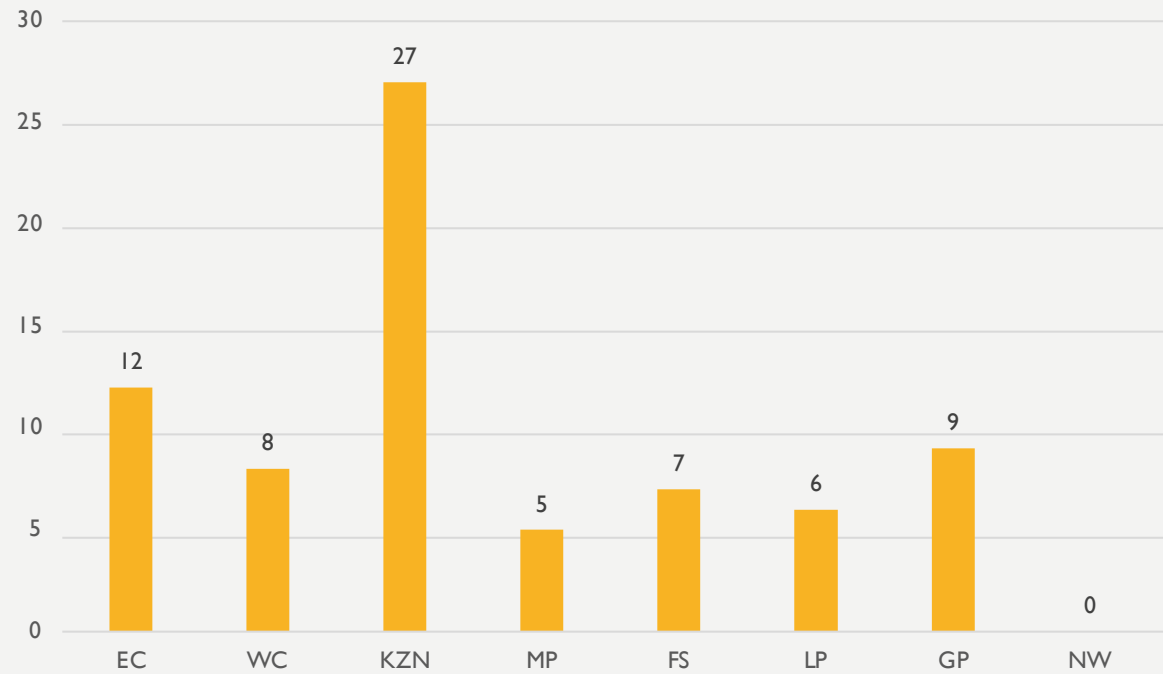
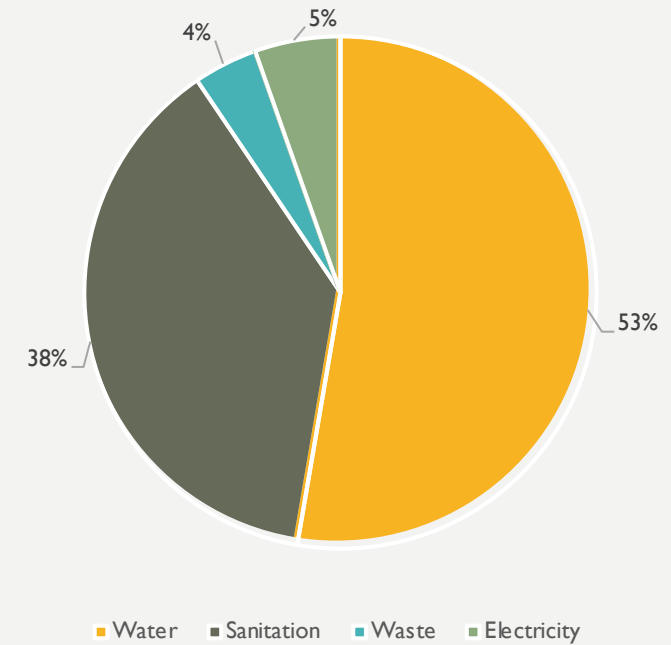


Fig 3. - Type of upgrades

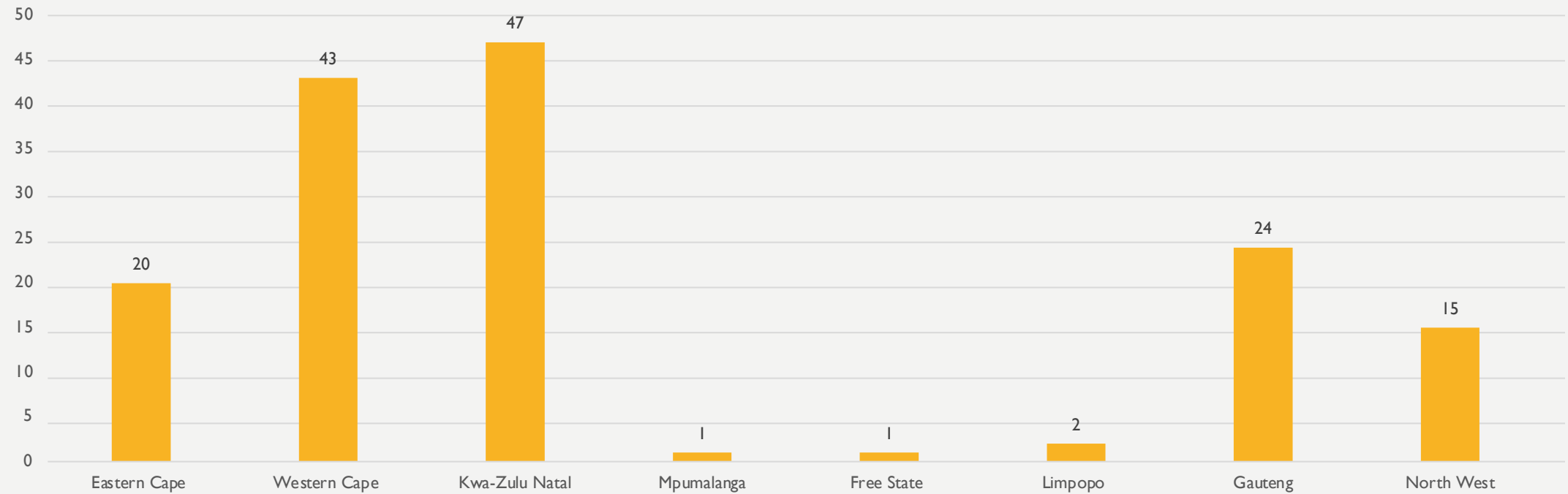

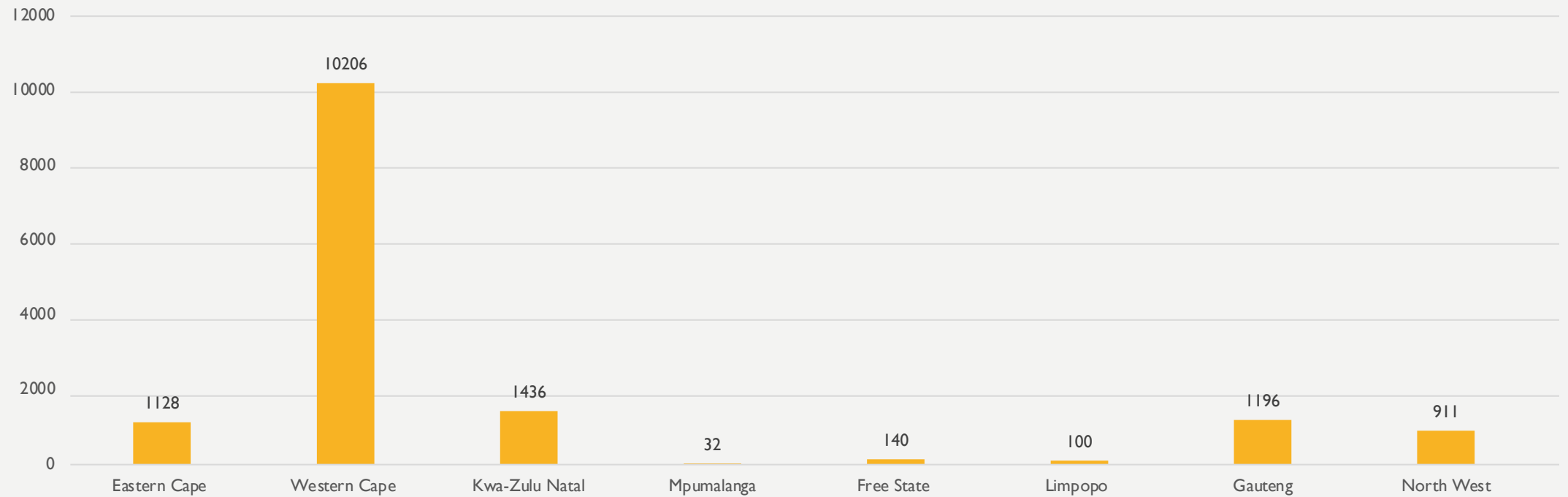

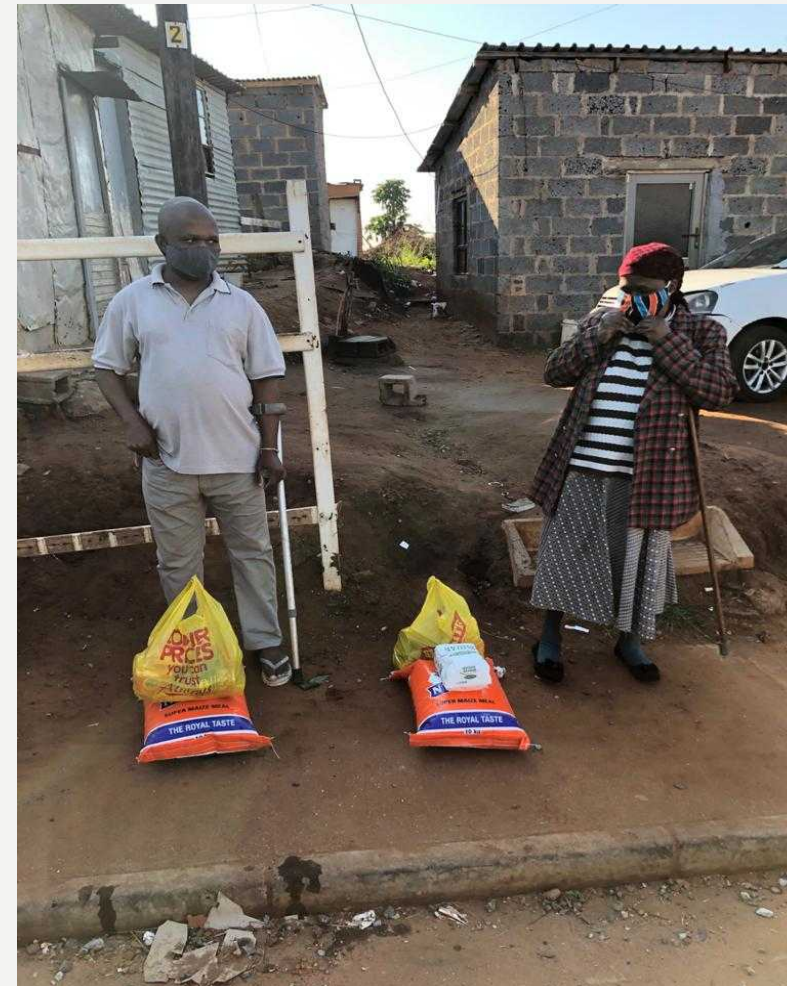

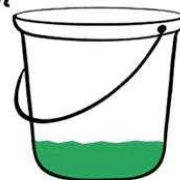
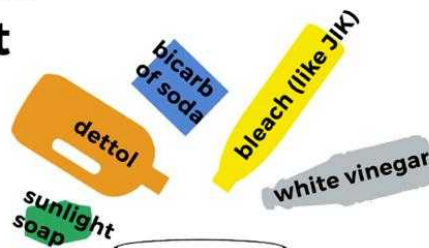
How to make your own disinfectant

Use this mixture to clean frequently
touched surfaces
See poster on touch points for guidance
on where to clean!

STEP 1

MIX THESE INGREDIENTS

- 1/2 a bar sunlight soap grate or cut small
- x 3 caps of dettol
- x 5 tablespoons bicarb of soda
- 750ml bottle of bleach (like JIK)
- 750ml of white vinegar



STEP 2

ADD WATER

- Add water to the container with the disinfectant ingredients.
- This mix will make 25 litres of disinfectant.



STEP 3

DIVIDE THE DISINFECTANT
Divide the disinfectant into plastic
bottles and share between households.



Now wash your hands!

After disinfecting key touch points clean your hands!
Washing your hands for 20 seconds with soap and water is still number 1
If you are using sanitiser from the shops make sure it has at least 70%
alcohol content.

DO YOU USE SHARED TAPS AND TOILETS IN AN INFORMAL SETTLEMENT?

TO AVOID GETTING THE CORONAVIRUS:

1. Don't touch the tap, toilet or door handle with your bare hands.
2. Hold the tap, door handle or toilet lid with newspaper.
3. You can also use your foot or shoulder to open the toilet door and lift the lid.
4. Stand at least 6 steps away from other people when you queue for a toilet or tap.
5. After using the toilet or tap – do not touch your face, eyes, nose or mouth until you wash your hands with soap and water.
6. Clean the toilet or tap with 1 litre of water mixed with 4 teaspoons of Jik/bleach (but keep this bleach mixture away from children).

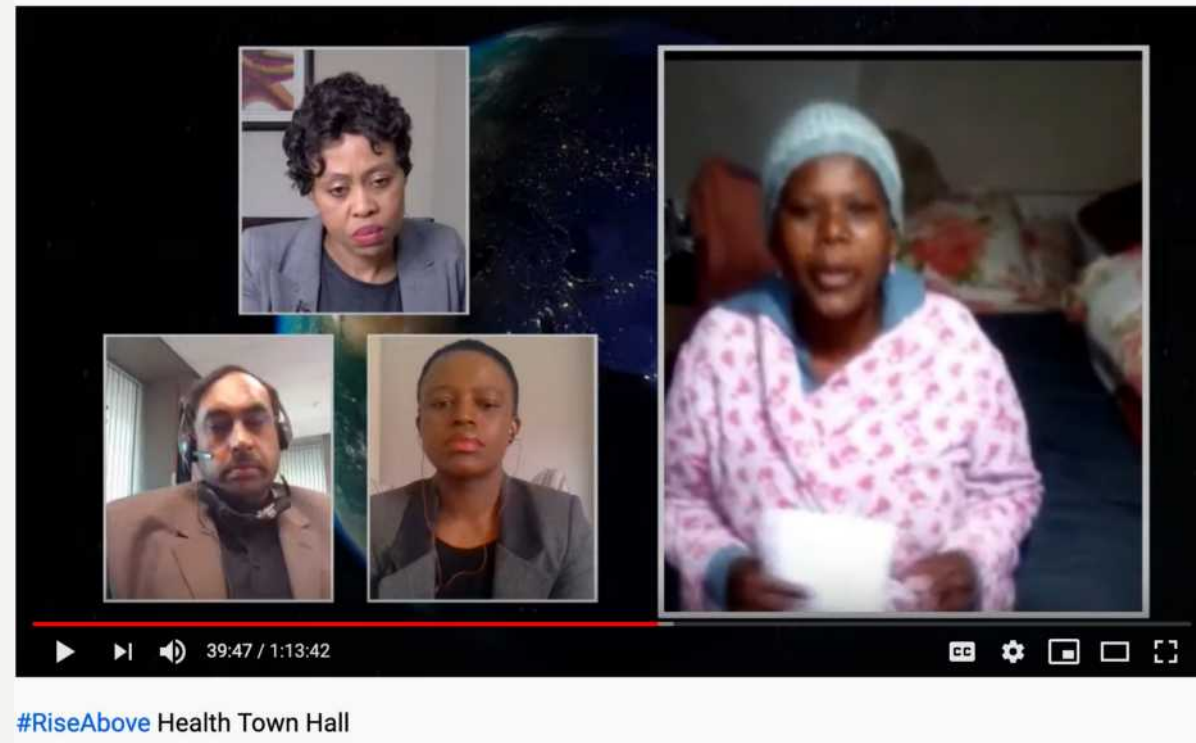
